



Recently I watched the documentary *Unknown: Cave of Bones*, which is an extinct hominid known as homo naledi that lived during the Middle Pleistocene period that dates back 335,000 – 236,000 years ago. 
Shrove Tuesday Pancakes Supper

Empty Bowls Event

Over 2023, inflation has continued to impact families in need.

Last month, Love Chapel's food pantry provided groceries for 97 families who came to the pantry on one day, hungry and looking for help. Over the month, a total of 1204 households and over 4400 individuals received groceries from Love Chapel.

To meet the increased need, Love Chapel purchased 54,107 pounds of food in one month to supplement food donated by the community. And these numbers don't reflect the number of people served at the Salvation Army, the Hope Food Bank, local shelters, and the hot meal sites.

This year, Empty Bowls will take place on Saturday March 23, 2024 at Central Middle School. As always, 100% of the money raised during the event goes directly to local food pantries and shelters in Bartholomew County.

Vestry Minutes—January 9, 2024

January Vestry meeting was held on Zoom.

Present: Br. Æred Dean, Don Wools (Jr Warden), Nancy McKinney, Steve Talbert, Kelli Thompson, Frank Guthrie, Andrew Goldsmid, Cindy Overmyer (Treasurer).

Excused or not present: Barb Parker, Julie Abedian, Nancy Ardizone,

Meeting convened at 5:30 PM with prayer led by Br. Ælred.

A quorum was present. December minutes were approved (Frank moved, Kelli seconded, 6-0 approved).

Finance Report - Treasurer Cindy Overmyer presented the year-end 2023 Finance Report

More than \$42,000 in the bank as of December 31, 2023, covering about 2-1/2 months of operating expenses, and a CD that will mature for \$26,500 in early April. There is \$390,000 in the diocese investment account as of December 31, 2021.

Financial support from the congregation has continued to be very strong. We have no debt, and we are in a good financial position, even after replacing most of our heating and cooling systems in 2023 (the major Sanctuary HVAC project, plus two of the three systems in the office/classroom areas).

2023 receipts and offerings for the operating budget, including pledges, were favorable to budget. Operating expenses were also favorable to budget.

The non-operating Building Fund expenses of \$63,700 (\$45,500 for Sanctuary HVAC replacement, \$10,100 for two other HVAC replacements, and \$8,100 for limestone repairs) were about 87% funded, from donations and fund transfers. Some HVAC donations are anticipated in 2024; the remaining unfunded amount can be taken from the Undesignated (Operating) Fund balance.

The 2024 Budget will go to the January 21 Annual Meeting. Cindy's summary:

35 pledges so far for 2024 and anticipate active financial support from several non-pledging parishioners. Rental income of \$6,300 will come from Hoosier Action and Nurse Family Partnership. CD interest is budgeted for \$1,250.

The budget includes revisions for clergy and staff increases after Finance Committee and Vestry were pleased to recognize their excellent work.

We are presenting a budget with \$189,650 in revenue and \$200,962 in expenses, for a net deficit of \$11,312. The 2024 budget deficit is an improvement compared with 2023's budget deficit, and also compared with plans made during the rector search process. The deficit will be funded from St. Paul's cash and investment assets.

Cindy thanked Barb Parker for her work as Assistant Treasurer and thanked Finance Committee for their work.

Vestry approved submitting the 2024 proposed budget to the Annual Meeting for approval (Frank moved, Andrew seconded, passed 6-0).

Vestry Minutes, continued

Office Internet - Steve said GigabitNow called back and corrected their previous quote. \$50 per month was the residential rate. St. Paul's would have to be on the commercial rate and that would be \$99 per month. The new contract with Comcast will be less and the parish will keep Comcast Business. GigabitNow can be installed later when the optical fiber gets closer or if needs change.

Phones – The Comcast landline number has not yet ported to the new Comcast mobile phone that will sit on Kathi's desk. Steve has support tickets open with Comcast and is pushing to get the number to activate soon. After the number is activated then the order will be submitted for the lower internet rate.

Candidates for Vestry Class 2024 – Three vestry members are rotating-out in 2024. Ælred said that the Nominating Committee received confirmation from John DeLap that he would serve. They also have candidates for the other two positions. After they accept they will be announced at the annual meeting.

Other Discussion Items

Nurse Family Partnership (NFP) moves in Friday Jan 12, Æred announced. Don and Andrew discussed the thermostat schedule for the rooms. The women's restroom needed more heat so Don turned on the supplemental electric heater.

Building and Grounds Committee will use one of the two Samsung tablets to control thermostats. They will assign the tablet to rotate with whomever is on-call.

Br Ælred is starting a new catechism class.

Annual meeting will be January 21. Send in reports. Delegates do not need to be elected at this annual meeting because delegates are in their third/final year in 2024. Plan to elect delegates next year.

Adjourned - Frank moved, Don seconded, approved 6-0

Br Ælred closed with prayer.

Employee Schedules



Financial Summary

December: YTD Actual Revenue is \$171,417 as compared to the budget of \$166,100 for a favorable budget difference of \$5,317. However, a better measure for the year is Pledge Receipts, with YTD Actual of \$171,417, as compared to the budget of \$150,600, for a favorable budget difference of \$20,817. (The revenue budget included \$15,500 of investment income, which was unused.) YTD Actual Revenue is \$171,417 as compared to the previous year of \$157,002 for a favorable year-over-year difference of \$14,415. YTD Actual Expenditures are \$186,506 as compared to the budget of \$196,844 for a favorable budget difference of (\$10,338).




