Empty Bowls — March 23

St. Paul's parishioners were delighted to join the group of volunteers who made 60 gallons of soup and chili for Empty Bowls. This was nearly twice the amount that has been prepared in recent years, and diners ate all of it because of the all-you-can-eat option introduced this year.

This annual fundraiser benefits six local food pantries and shelters: Horizon House, Thrive Alliance, Turning Point Domestic Violence Services, The Salvation Army, Community Center of Hope food pantry and the Love Chapel food pantry and Brighter Days emergency shelter. This year, the soup dinner was held at Central Middle School on March 23rd.

The numbers are still being crunched, but the organizers are hopeful that the goal of \$25,000 will be not only met but surpassed.

Love Chapel: Chef's Kiss

As we go through this year, Love Chapel's needs have continued to increase, and they estimate they will need to raise an additional \$100,000 through grants and about that same amount through additional fundraising. Love Chapel is planning a signature event this fall. The preliminary plans are to offer a meal prepared by four or five local chefs and make it a "Taste of Columbus" type event which will be called "Chef's Kiss".

The hope is to get sponsors for the event and to host a night where attendees can have an appetizer from one chef, a main entree from another, a side dish from another, and a dessert. Tickets for \$50 each or in tables of 8, and the evening would include a silent auction, raffle, and entertainment.

Join Us for an Ecumenical National Day of Prayer!



Minutes of meeting from March 12, 2024

Vestry meeting was conducted in the parish conference room. Zoom session opened for any others needing to attend.

Present:, Andrew Goldsmid (Sr Warden), Don Wools (Jr Warden), Stephen Talbert (Clerk), Frank Guthrie, Nancy Ardizone, Jill Clotfelter, John DeLap

Excused or not present: Nancy McKinney, Kirk Parsons, Br. Aelred Dean was at diocesan clergy conference,

Meeting convened at 5:30 PM with prayer led by Sr Warden Andrew Goldsmid. Quorum was present.

February 13 minutes were approved (John moved, Frank seconded, 7-0 approved).

Reports

Finance Report – Vestry-Finance Laison Frank Guthrie

Operating revenue was highly favorable for the month and for year to date. Actual pledge revenue YTD was \$60,116, compared with YTD budget of \$27,767. The large favorability came from parishioners who paid in Feb. for most or all of their 2024 pledge, as well as an unbudgeted donation. Plan on not as much monthly revenue in upcoming months since so many pledges were paid early.

Nurse Family Partnership rent for January and February was paid on February 2. Hoosier Action rent was received in early March.

Operating expense was favorable for the month and for year to date. Telecomm is higher than budget because annual Zoom fee was paid (\$129). The Comcast bill didn't decrease in February, but it will be \$0.00 for March & April.

Cash Activities page includes February adjustments:

- Negative fund balances in Music/Education and Flower Funds were closed, as discussed last month.
- \$70 January UTO Fund Balance will have a \$140 correction in March.
- The \$25,000 CD will mature April 5 and will move to the Operating Account.

Outreach Report (Andrew Goldsmid)

The Feb 18th Outreach Meeting was well attended with several new faces participating in the discussion of upcoming activities. Barb Parker presented the calendar list of activities, and Kimberly Free constructed a sign-up sheet for the same which is placed at the back of the Sanctuary.

Upcoming activities are: Empty Bowls bread and soup supper at Central Middle School from 5:00 to 7:00 pm on Saturday March 23rd. The St Paul's Chefs are asked to bring chili to the church and Aelred will deliver it.

Book Buddies Party April 11th 11:30am to 12:30pm in the Parish Hall. BCSC provide Pizza and St Paul's the lemonade along with a reading book for every student (2nd & 3rd Grades). Our books are purchased from Viewpoint (Beth Stroh) and we add a St Paul's label created by Elizabeth Monette. Aelred is coordinating this year's event. We expect to welcome 20 students and their reading buddies.

St Paul's Clean Up Day - The 6th Graders at Schmitt Elementary are again proposing a spring clean-up day at St Paul's. The school has 3 6th grade classes of ~20 students with each class working for one hour on tasks assigned by St Paul's. Tasks include Dusting, polishing, tidying, cleaning (including windows and blinds) etc. Each class is divided into 3 groups and assigned a St Paul's person to coordinate. The event lasts from ~10:00 am to 2:00 with a Pizza lunch at 12:30pm for the St Paul's folk while the students eat at Schmitt. The date of this year's event remains TBD, possibly Weds April 3rd? Andrew hopes to coordinate this event but is on Vacation April 7 to April 29.

Schmitt Family Night April 18 from 5:30-7 pm. Schmitt have invited St Paul's to participate in this event They plan to have lots of food trucks (with a kick back coming to Schmitt PTO) and plan to have a space/solar system theme. More information is expected, if you are interested, please talk to Aelred.

Vestry

Minutes (con't)

Formation (John DeLap)

The idea of an Easter sunrise service was presented to the congregation during the March 3rd worship service. John said that Aelred wants to go forward with it. This would be a simple service with Eucharist. The service would be conducted in the field between the church and Schmitt Elementary School. Sunrise will occur around 7:28 am so we would gather around 7:10. Coffee and doughnuts to follow.

Formation will be writing a short piece for the Venite each month on Creation Care. These short pieces will reflect on the importance of the natural world to our physical and mental health.

Br Aelred and John DeLap are putting together a "St. Paul's Reads" presentation around the book, "The Practice of the Presence of God" by Brother Lawrence. This short book was written almost 300 years ago and presents Brother Lawrence's practices of finding God in the things we do throughout our daily routines.

Action Needed

Approve funding for shelving for the northwest closet in the Parish Hall, for the Bridge Club to store supplies. The group provides a free will offering every week of approximately \$20-30 per week. John moved to purchase 2 shelf units from building and grounds. Andrew seconded. Approved, 7-0.

Julia Abedian and Don Wools will work on a grant from Church Collaborative Partnership regarding:

Shelving in basement for the schools' assistance packages

Better lighting on East Side

Update and add smoke detectors

Aelred met with the Fire Department for an inspector to review the campus and make recommendations for smoke/CO2 detectors. Recommendations will be coming.

Don reminded Vestry that the fire marshall always says that doors must be closed when rooms are not in-use. People should not leave doors open when a room is not being used.

Discussion

- 1. Auto Track and Auto Focus Camera and potential future needs for livestreaming. Discussion: Stephen and media committee to discuss and return
- b. Cleaning and painting outdoor church signage with a QR Code. Property committee, Outreach and Aelred are considering.
- c. Fundraising possibility: Selling peanut brittle. Peanut Brittle (6 to 7 people) special equipment.
- e. Kelli's suggestion for Room Signage Property Committee will have plaques made with room numbers.
- $f.\ ``Esthetic\ Policy"-Julia\ Abedian\ will\ send\ Aelred\ CRH's\ design/esthetic\ policy,\ which\ would\ pertain\ to\ signs\ and\ notices\ posted\ throughout\ the\ building.$
- g. Dedicated Memorial Wall will be discussed while discussing a proposed Esthetic Policy.

Items in-development or Back-burner Items

- 1. Metal doors should be replaced in the furnace room and undercroft.
- 2. Aelred and Barb are discussing a replacement for the diocesan mutual ministry document.
- 3. Parking lot needs sealed. East Parking lot will need significant work.
- 4. Get property line information and possible tree trimming.
- 5. Video Streaming Don suggested that an upgrade of the worship video streaming be explored this year. Stephen agreed and will gather what changes people want and what equipment may be needed. Will suggest options later this year, and approach congregation to see what they would support.
- 6. Loesch will be sending a person to login the thermostats.

Adjourned (John moved, Frank seconded, approved 7-0) Andrew closed with prayer.

YTD Actual Revenue is \$60,991 as compared to the previous year of \$34,544 for a favorable year-over-year difference of \$26,447. YTD Actual Expenditures are \$32,637 as compared to the budget of \$34,611 for a favorable budget difference of (\$1,974).


