So as I take my leave, I have one more scout song to share...

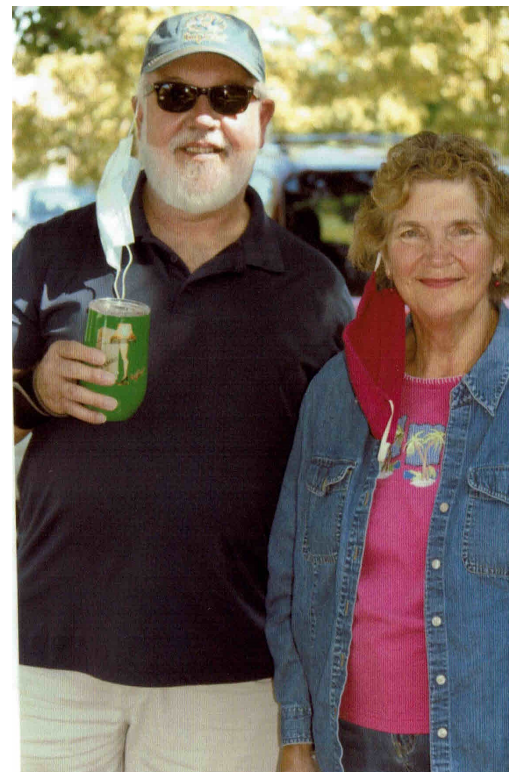
*Fare thee well, luck go with thee, when I'm far, remember me.*

## Formation

### Seven Habits of Healthy Congregations

A few weeks ago, the Center for Congregations offered a webinar entitled "The Seven Habits of Healthy Congregations". The webinar was presented by the Rev. Dr. Marcus Carlson who describes himself as: Jesus Follower, Dad, theologian, social scientist, connector, pastor, professor, non-profit leader, author, speaker, consultant, instigator, spiritual director, teacher, and writer.

Having attended the webinar, I shared some of the information at a Forum here at St. Paul's on May 15<sup>th</sup>. Here are the highlights of that Forum.

The first thing that Dr. Marcus emphasized was that "Health trumps everything!" Healthy things grow. Health is NOT the default, health is intentional. Health doesn't always feel natural. Getting healthy is hard, messy, and tiring. Most organizations are not unhealthy or healthy in all aspects of their lives, but on a spectrum. EDUCATION is the key to Healthy Congregations.

Parishes today have several challenges. There are fewer clergy, and fewer people joining congregations overall. Parishes need to use The Seven Habits... to assess their health in various areas of parish life so they can grow spiritually and numerically.

#### **The Habits**

1. A Healthy Congregation is a praying congregation. "What we pray for we love, and we love what we pray for!"
2. A Healthy Congregation does conflict well.
3. A Healthy Congregation makes decisions in a healthy way.
4. A Healthy Congregation is focused on those outside the congregation.
5. A Healthy Congregation values process
6. Healthy Congregations focus on adoption over assimilation. (People feel like they Belong, which leads to belief and behavior).
7. Healthy Congregations are not territorial.

Interested in learning more? Dr. Marcus Carlson is available to present in parishes. The Center for Congregations has matching grants to help parishes bring resource people to their churches.

### Workshop #2 to Prepare for Transition

On June 12, a workshop on the MINISTRY OF WELCOME AND INCORPORATION will be held following worship in the Conference Room. At this workshop we will share ideas of how to welcome people and devise a protocol for welcoming newcomers into parish life. All are welcome.

## Buildings and Grounds

### Masonry Repairs

Earlier this year Repp and Mundt, a local contractor, resurfaced the limestone steps to the office area and other surfaces. The steps were badly pitted, there were gaps in the mortar joints and significant erosion and a gap between two corner blocks.

We found out that limestone erosion is a common problem. Most of our problems have likely been caused by the winter use of Ice Melt which is applied on horizontal surfaces, but also splashes onto the vertical ones. The Ice-Melt product was engineered for concrete to overcome pitting caused by salt, but does not do well with limestone.

We talked and received similar price quotes from three contractors. Two proposed to replace the eroded blocks with new ones, the third contractor Repp and Mundt recommended the use of a patching material Planitop to resurface and patch the limestone. It's probable that new limestone would deteriorate like the old, while cement based Planitop behaves like concrete while providing a longer lasting solution.

After discussion the team settled on resurfacing with Planitop. We recognized that it would not be an exact match for limestone, but our limestone varies too, and the results are acceptable. The quote was for time and material and the final bill was substantially less than the quote, and a nice surprise for finance and vestry.

### Spring Clean-up Day

**Mark your calendar for Clean up Day on Saturday, June 11.** Rain or shine the annual St. Paul's Clean Up day is scheduled for Saturday June 11th starting at 9:00 am. A list of possible tasks includes: pressure washing the concrete walkway at the front of the church, trimming trees on the South side, painting the Vesting Room, and cleaning the back hallway. If you have a task for Buildings and Grounds, or fancy leading one of the projects, please talk to Bill Garber, Nick Firestone, or Andrew Goldsmid. Remember St. Paul's is your Church, we are in it together, and we can't take care of things we don't know about.



## Outreach

### Turning Point Yard Clean-Up

Once again a group from St. Paul's descended upon the green space at our local shelter for domestic abuse victims in hopes of making their lives a bit more beautiful. The group also heard the plans to renovate the building next door so that the Turning Point administration could be housed in ONE building rather than across the county as is currently the situation. This will also allow more living space to house Turning Point families.

Over the years, St. Paul's parishioners have donated many plants which have flourished in the green space at Turning Point. It will be interesting to see what changes the renovations will have to the foliage.



**Next up:** FISH ingathering – We will have our annual ingathering for the food pantries in our area. Our plan is to have a speaker at the July 17<sup>th</sup> Sunday Service to talk to us about the positive impact Love Chapel has had on their life.

### June 2022 Search Committee Update

Stay tuned for a complete overhaul of our current website. A formal proposal from Q7 Associates of Indianapolis is expected by the end of this week. Once the proposal is received, the Search/Vestry will schedule a meeting/s to decide on our next steps. This as an important part of the Search Process: our website provides that important first impression.

The members of the Search Committee were informed that Jen Phelps, Director of Transition Ministry, will need to have major surgery in June and will be recovering at home for six weeks. As soon as we update our website, our job opening will be reposted. Should we get a candidate during Jen's absence, Canon Kristin White will notify us and assist us with the next steps.

Somewhere out there is a priest waiting to answer our call. We need your continued prayers for patience and perseverance as we connect with that person, in God's time.

## Worship

### Presiding Bishop's Visit

On June 4<sup>th</sup>, the Presiding Bishop, Michael Curry, will celebrate a Festival Holy Eucharist at the Monroe Convention Center in Bloomington. An outdoor reception will follow. To attend, register on-line on the Diocesan website.

Pentecost is one of the 4 Feasts of the church that Baptism is deemed most appropriate.

June 5<sup>th</sup> is Pentecost Sunday. This year St. Paul's will baptize Zaden and Drace Vera (grandsons of Cheryl Christopher and great grandsons of Julia Christopher) during the 10:15 celebration of the Eucharist. A reception to meet and greet Zaden and Drace will be held in the Parish Hall following the service. All are invited to join in the festivities.

On Pentecost Sunday we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the 12 apostles. It is also known as the Birthday of the Church. It is traditional for everyone to wear red. So check your closets and plan to wear your best and brightest RED this Pentecost Sunday!

The meeting began at 6:30 PM with prayer by Andrew and a Check-In "Task List for Clean-Up Day". Responses included powerwashing sidewalks, cleaning basement, painting vesting room, cleaning back hallway and trimming trees on south side.

**Procedural Business**

We had a quorum.

A motion to accept the April Vestry minutes was made by Shelly, seconded by Barb, and approved by all.

The date for the next Vestry meeting, June 14, was confirmed.

**Finance Report**

Rev. Kathy reported another good month financially with pledge receipts above budget. Activity with designated funds included donations and expenses for chimes and donations of \$3500 for building fund which will help cover the limestone step repair bill. It was noted that the diocesan payment was not made in April, but that two payments will be made.

**Old Business**

Rev. Kathy reported that 21 attended the Rebecca Fenske Memorial Service.

The congregational survey to receive input on service times, coffee hour, etc. hasn't been done yet. ACTION: Shelly will set up the survey with questions for each area, such as worship, parish life, etc., and Kelli will create the survey.

**New Business**

There was no new business.

**Reports: Re-Opening Committee**

Kelli and Vicki said there was no need to make adjustments, but masks are optional and social distancing is recommended.

**Reports: Building and Grounds**

Andrew reported on the signage on California Street. He said that he had talked with Victoria Bell, who had several ideas. He thought adding the Episcopal shield would be good. Shelly suggested that a traditional board would be helpful; Bill wondered if contacting Repp and Mund would help. ACTION: Andrew will set a meeting with interested persons.

Concerning the altar steps and rails, Frank had indicated that he would walk through the church with an architect friend of his.

In regard to the Venite article on masonry work, Andrew will do this.

The matter of cleaning issues and check list for cleaners had not been addressed yet. ACTION: Nancy Morris will follow up and advise the Vestry.

Clean Up Day is June 11. The To Do List includes items mentioned earlier in the Check-In. Barb added that lighting in women's bathroom needs work. She also reported that recycling has not been picked up so she cancelled that with Rumpke, but that they are still doing trash pickup.

**Reports: Outreach**

Andrew reported that 4 people worked last week, weeding and planting, at Turning Point. He has received a thank you from them.

Andrew spoke of Fish for July, saying he would like to schedule a speaker who had first-hand knowledge of the program. Rev. Kathy suggested July 17 as that is a Morning Prayer.

**Reports: Parish Life**

Shelly reported that the Craft, Hobby and Bake Sale May 14 went well, with \$105 donated to Love Chapel and \$14 to Book Buddies, with other donations that covered the cost of advertising.

May 22<sup>nd</sup> is designated Graduation Celebration. Rev. Kathy showed certificates to be given to graduates and Shelly said there would be coffee and cake after the service.

Shelly noted that coffee hours are being planned only for occasions.

A Farewell Luncheon for Rev. Kathy has been set for her last Sunday, June 26. Andrew suggested having a pitch-in meal.

Shelly also noted planning for the church picnic, possibly in October, is underway.

**Reports: Search Update**

Barb reported talking with Jen Phelps, transition minister for the diocese, and learned that she will be out of her office in July, but that Canon Kristin White will cover her duties. Barb emphasized the need to get St. Paul's new website up and running ASAP, as the number of priests available is severely limited and we need to make ourselves as attractive as possible.

**Reports: Worship Committee**

There was no Altar Guild update.

Rev. Kathy noted that two baptisms are set for Pentecost, June 5. She will decide on the alter color, as Pentecost is red and baptisms are white.

Rev. Kathy also reported that there was no technology last Sunday.

Rev. Kathy told of her workshop last Sunday on "Seven Habits of Healthy Congregations" and gave handouts to the Vestry. Her next workshop is May 29 on "Planning and Officiating Worship," and the final workshop is June 12 on "Ministry of Welcome." (Nancy and Andrew are to make a procedure for welcome.) She suggested using the Bishop's initiative "The Way of Love" in formation activities. Andrew and Barb said St. Paul's has already used it.

Rev. Kathy reminded the group of the Presiding Bishop's Celebration in Bloomington June 4 and recommended making reservations quickly.

**Reports: Interim Rector**

Rev. Kathy reported that Kathi W. is continuing work on obtaining supply priests through September.

Rev. Kathy said she had made several pastoral calls to church members with Covid.

Vicki gave a closing prayer, and the meeting was adjourned.

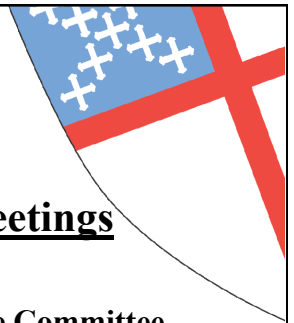
