### From our Priest





Saint Paul's Episcopal Church is a faith community that worships the living God revealed through Jesus Christ our Lord. We are also a safe place for outside organizations. Our lay leadership and I are committed to reaching out to our community to grow the parish and establish St. Paul's as a community center.

Recently, I saw a t-shirt that read, "I'm not old - I'm mid-century modern." Even though mid-century modern is alive in Columbus, equipment in our mid-century modern architectural building called St. Paul's Episcopal Church is getting older. You may not be aware that St. Paul's HVAC system in the sanctuary is from the 1960s and is wearing out and inefficient in electrical use. If the current HVAC system breaks down, parts are most likely unavailable, leaving us without heating or air conditioning. The HVAC system in the sanctuary needs immediate attention and replacing it with a new effi-

cient, cost-saving system. The estimated cost of replacing and updating the current system is 40K.

The goal is to raise the necessary funds as quickly as possible before the system fails, leaving us out in the cold or heat, as it were. I'm writing this letter as a financial appeal to cover the purchase and installation of a new HVAC system. The following steps are requested to move forward with this project:

- The first step is to pray that the St. Paul family can raise all the funds necessary to cover the expenses.
- Secondly, prayerfully consider making a financial pledge or contribution towards purchasing the new HVAC system.
- Thirdly, designate your financial gift for the new HVAC project.

St. Paul's needs the support of our members to help us reach our goal. Your ongoing support of our beloved parish is deeply appreciated. Don't hesitate to contact vestry members or me if you have questions, concerns, or more details about this important fundraising effort.

Thank you for your prayerful and thoughtful consideration of meeting the financial cost of this critical and urgent project. I want to express my gratitude for your ongoing financial support for St. Paul's.



### **Empty Bowls Returns in 2023 In-Person!**

Hunger is real in our beautiful community – needs at local food pantries are up 25-30% just this year alone. Every month, over 5,000 Bartholomew County residents seek food from local food pantries. **Empty Bowls** is a fundraiser which raises money for six local agencies that help meet this need and also brings much needed awareness to the problem of food insecurity.

The community is invited to the 25th annual Empty Bowls fundraiser, which will be held on *Saturday, February 25th at Central Middle School from 5:30-7:00pm*. \$15 tickets will be available on the Empty Bowls Facebook page and on the day of the event. Guests will enjoy unlimited soup, bread, and 2 cookies. Additional desserts will be available for pur-



chase. Our ever-popular Artisan Bowls will also be available for purchase and include a guest's choice from a variety of ceramic bowls crafted by local artists, teachers, and students. Music at this year's event will be provided by Dan and Linda Mustard.

100% of the proceeds from Empty Bowls go directly to 6 local pantries and shelters: Love Chapel, Turning Point, the Salvation Army, the Community Center of Hope, Thrive Alliance, and Horizon House. Representatives from all 6 agencies will be present at the event with information to share.

Many of our St. Paul's parishioners have helped with Empty Bowls in the past, and I feel we have several new parishioners who would also join with us this year. The past few years, the St. Paul's Soupers have stirred up 6-8 gallons of beef chili each February to donate. *This year, I'm wondering if we wanted to go a step further and volunteer on the day of the event as well as donate chili.* They need volunteers for set-up, food prep, serving, and clean up. I'm thinking we could get a group to roll up our sleeves and help with one of these tasks. You can also support Empty Bowls simply by purchasing a ticket to attend the event. **Remember: 100% of the money raised by Empty Bowls goes directly to local food pantries and volunteers.** Their goal this year is to host 500 guests and raise \$20,000. They can do it with our help!!

### The Order of the Daughters of the King

### HAPPY 23RD BIRTHDAY, EPIPHANY CHAPTER!

Do you know The Order of the Daughters of the King? It is a group of women, mostly Episcopalians but also Lutherans and Roman Catholics, who take vows to pray daily, to serve their parish and community, and to show others by word and deed the love of Christ (evangelism in other words). The Order began in 1885 when a Sunday school class of young women decided they wanted a way to help them live their baptismal vows more fully. Their ideas grew into a national and international organization of thousands of women.

Do you know Epiphany Chapter, St. Paul's, Columbus? February 14, 1999 nine women at St. Paul's, who had studied and prayed for discernment, took their vows of prayer, service and evangelism. Epiphany Chapter was chartered and officers installed in a service that also asked the parish to support us. As I remember it, you answered "we will" with the characteristic enthusiasm of our parish. You sang with us "Lift high the Cross".

Do you know after I had been to diocesan and province assemblies of Daughters where it was customary to hold one's hand up while singing the opening refrain of Lift High the Cross, I could no longer keep my hands down! That action had become a prayer, a yearning, to be so full of the love of Christ that I would do whatever I could to help the "world adore His Holy Name." So, if you long time parishioners ever wondered why my hands were up there...now you know.

Over the years, our membership changed but we met regularly, prayed for each other and members of the parish, for our friends and family. We studied several books on prayer, saints and service. We also offered quiet days for the parish and mornings of spiritual practices and reflection. Nearly 10 years ago, our then rector led us in a study and training about healing prayer. We started a healing prayer ministry which continues today but online. The members our Epiphany Chapter continue to lead this ministry, which is open to whoever feels called, and membership in the Order is not required.



The Prayer and Meditation Room is a part of the healing prayer ministry made possible through a generous gift of a parishioner in 2019. Prior to our church building being closed due to COVID, ministers were there each Sunday after the services to pray with those who desired it. It is always available for anyone who would like a quiet place to pray. In fact, members of the AA groups stop in for prayer or a quiet place for one on one with a mentor.

### **All Things Liturgical**

The word "liturgy" has a very long history pre-dating Christianity. The original use of that word meant "A public office or duty performed voluntarily by a rich Athenian." In other words, wealthy Athenians would pay for public services for the people. Today in the United States, public services are paid for by individuals, small businesses, and corporations. However, that original understanding has changed through time and tides to mean a formulary practice of conducting public worship.

Anglicans worldwide and Episcopalians nationwide have experienced liturgical changes, which can make people squirm. No matter if we like to admit it or not, people are creatures of habit and love our rituals, from morning routines to our celebrations of holidays. We are creatures of habit.

The only constant in life is change. Even God isn't stagnant, as God is always moving toward us in mercy and love. The above is long-winded to say there will be a lot of familiar and comforting liturgical practices that will remain with some additions.

One change is that Rite I will be the Eucharistic rite for the last Sunday of each month. There is a significant group at St. Paul's that values that rite, and to ensure they feel included in the worship life of our parish, Rite I will be the formulary of the day.

Even though Easter seems far off and in the distant future, it will be here sooner than we think. On Easter Sunday, Christians worldwide will celebrate the resurrection of our Lord Jesus the Christ; incense will be used. Believe it or not, Episcopalians have strong opinions about the use of incense. There are Episcopalians that adore and want incense used at every service, and there are Episcopalians that begin to cough at the sight of a thurible.

There will be one more introduction to a Celtic Eucharist. You may be rightfully wondering what a Celtic Eucharist is. I found one definition: "A Celtic service is a candlelight service using sacred music to provide a meditative worship experience; it is a service steeped in tradition." We will celebrate a Celtic Eucharist together at the end of our Wednesday evening Lenten program.

I welcome your feedback as we walk in love and serve God and each other.

### **Financial Summary**

**November 2022:** YTD Actual Revenue is \$137,119 as compared to the budget of \$133,833 for a favorable difference of \$3,286. YTD Actual Revenue is \$137,119 as compared to the previous year of \$133,134 for a favorable difference of \$3,985. YTD Actual Expenditures are \$125,893 as compared to the budget of \$148,043 for a favorable difference of (\$22,150). Budget and actual do not include investment income or rector search, which have not been used so far in 2022, except for \$939 rector search expense.

Pledge results are not complete but show an increase over last year.

Cindy asked for discussion on the 2023 Budget and then for vestry approval. Shelly moved to approve the 2023 budget, Vicki seconded, approved.

No current problems with the janitorial services. ACTION: Aelred will check on weekly and monthly To Do lists.

Andrew reported on the office steps and a proposal to caulk/pointing/seal limestone joints. He said a representative of Repp & Mundt, Jeff Brunner, will be at St. Paul's on Wednesday, January 11, at 2:30 PM.

Concerning the aging HVAC system, Andrew gave a quote of \$40,000 from Loesch, with a second quote needed. Andrew recommended going ahead with the project, as prices are likely to increase. ACTION: Andrew will announce the decision at the Annual Meeting and state that funds from parishioners are welcomed and needed.

Discussion was held concerning the Ring doorbell and security camera system. ACTION: Andrew will consult with Ken Erikson and Chuck Boddie.




