It's June, and I'm still wondering how May came and went in a blink of an eye. As the adage says, "Time flies when you're having fun," which is true. I'm having the time of my life and want to know you and the people in Columbus. Since arriving on December 27, 2023, I've hit the road running in attending the MLK Community Breakfast, the Arc of Bartholomew County's "Always Ready for Chocolate" fundraiser, stood in solitary with APPAA (The Asian Pacific Islander Public Affairs Association) when an Asian student at IU was attacked, attending Board Meetings of the Ecumenical Assembly of Bartholomew Country (aka Love Chapel), a board member of Columbus IN Pride, inducted into the Kiwanis Club, becoming a book buddy, inducted into the Different Pastors Association, board member of Interfaith Columbus, and received my PREA Training through the county jail so I can have a pastoral presence for both inmates and staff. All that means one thing, I am settling in and building roots in Columbus as my new home.

I have been visiting parishioners and want to open it up to meet with everyone. Many consider pastoral visitation antiquated and impractical as we're all busier than ever. As a result, personal visits are often reserved only for the gravest of situations. I believe that pastoral visits are essential to the pastoral role. In Scripture, God visits his people to show his personal interest and concern, which is seen most clearly in the incarnation. Christ's ministry is one of presence. But Jesus is not only an example of visitation ministry; he embodies it. And in visitation, pastors and laypeople continue Jesus's ministry by bringing Christ to the individual in their very place of need.

Kathi and I will try to use Sign-Up Genius for you to look at dates and times when I plan to visit you in your homes. I invite you to sign-up, and if you are having difficulty, please call the office at 812-372-7869, and Kathi or I can manually enter your request for a visit. A pastoral visit is when we can get to know each other better and discuss what is on your heart and mind. Since you know your calendar better than me, I want to try Sign-Up Genius to schedule pastoral visits. If there is an inadequate response, I'll schedule pastoral visits the old-fashioned way by calling. The only expectation during a visit is to be yourself.

Soon you will receive an email from the parish office inviting you to sign up for a pastoral visit. I'm looking forward to visiting you and getting to know you better. Until then, may the Lord bless you and keep you; the Lord make his face to shine upon you and be gracious to you; the Lord lift his countenance upon you and give you peace.

Minutes from May 7, 2023

The meeting opened with prayer by Aelred.

Procedural Business:

There was a quorum. Motion to approve April meeting minutes made by Barb, seconded by Steve, accepted.

Reports:

Reports will be attached at end of minutes.

Action Items:

HVAC—Don reported that the committee had proposed recommending the \$45,700 bid from Loesch for fandriven gas furnaces and split off AC. Following discussion, motion made to accept by Barb, Julie seconded, accepted.

Altar Stairs—Andrew proposed a temporary solution to the stair problem be applying luminous tape. He will order it and apply it.

Discussion followed on more permanent solutions. Motion made by Kelli to contact architect Britt Brewer of IU School of Architecture to find a solution, seconded by Julie, accepted. After explanation by Don, motion made by Julie to apply for an Eli Lilly grant to get a full building assessment and authorize the church to spend up to \$1500, seconded by Andrew, accepted.

Discussion Items:

Reception of Communion—Aelred reported on Easter-time method of receiving communion by standing in front of the altar (with kneelers available).

Childcare: Don reported that he had been approached by an outside agency wanting to use the church for childcare, beginning in a month. He declined their offer. Julie suggested waiting for the CBCP report to determine our next steps.

Vestry Meeting Times—After discussion of the new meeting time of after church on the second Sunday, it was agreed to meet next on Wednesday, June 14 at noon.

Adjournment and Closing Prayer

Motion made by Don to adjourn, seconded by Barb, accepted.

The meeting closed with prayer by Aelred.

Marketing: Report to Vestry, Stephen Talbert, 7 May 2023

Columbus Pride -Pride festival will be September 30, 1:00-7:00 PM at Mill Race Park. Stephen will submit the application after getting a copy of the required 501(c)3 form. Booth coordinator and volunteers will be needed, as well as items to hand-out.

Logo -Stephen is researching contemporary church logos, and will research St. Paul's parish archives for seals or artwork which have been used. The better logos will inform a descriptive statement to be used to guide ideas from experts and stakeholders. Will share a suggested description, with examples from other churches on next report and ask for feedback. While we work that process I'm suggesting that the logo used on the website is still acceptable. It's clear and easily communicates location and the denominational brand.



Documentation for Social Media Accounts – Ken Erickson and Stephen discussed documenting logins for social media. Will collect the logins and report at next meeting. Plans for Facebook and the website will be reviewed.

Video Streaming – Several parishioners prefer streaming worship service from the website instead of through Facebook. The Mevo camera can stream to YouTube but it can't be guaranteed to be a live stream. We'll discuss options when addressing website maintenance and hosting service.

Priest in Charge: Report to Vestry, Ælred Dean

First, I want to thank the Vestry, Altar Guild members, and all servers who made Palm Sunday, Holy Week, and Easter possible. Everyone who serves God at and through St. Paul's is a blessing to our community This year for Maundy Thursday, we started the service in the Parish Hall for food and fellowship, followed by foot washing. Maundy Thursday concluded with the stripping of the chancel in preparation for Good Friday. I've only heard positive feedback regarding the whole Maundy Thursday experience, and I was asked to repeat it for Holy Week 2024.

As a member of the Worship Committee for the EABC (Ecumenical Assembly of Bartholomew), I helped plan the Good Friday Service for Love Chapel at Central High. This year I had the honor and privilege to open and participate in that service. Later that day, I presided at Good Friday Services at St. Paul's. Easter was a glorious day for worship, followed by Easter Brunch.

After Easter, I attended CREDO at ECCO (Episcopal Conference Center, Oakhurst) in California. CREDO is the best conference I have ever attended, followed by some personal time off to recover from Holy Week and CREDO. I have the supporting material and want to plan a CREDO workshop for St. Paul's.

As I'm out and about in the community, I have met Stephanie Zhang, chairperson of Indiana Action, an advocacy group supporting renter rights. I convinced her to hold their quarterly meeting here at St. Paul's. I attended that meeting, met many people, and took several visitors on a tour of our property. I am also a board member of Columbus Pride and convinced them to come to St. Paul's for their bi-monthly meetings. This committee is planning Columbus Pride, which will occur on September 30, 2023. St. Paul's must sign up for a "booth" at no cost. I asked the board if they would entertain a Pride Eucharist, where the proceeds go directly to Columbus Pride. We're in the early stages of discussing what that service would look like.

Britt Brewer asked me to sit as a juror for senior projects at the I. Miller Architecture Program. I thoroughly enjoyed that time with students, faculty members, staff, and guests. Everyone was shocked that a "priest" showed up to give constructive feedback to the students. I sat through and provided input to four student projects collaborating with ABC Stewart Montessori School.

I also attended PREA (Prison, Rape, Elimination Act) training at Bartholomew County Jail. This training allows me to be a pastoral presence for inmates and staff. I aim to give three hours every other week for pastoral work in the jail.

Last but not least, I've been working with the Parish Life and Formation Committees to plan future learning and fellowship opportunities.


